

**John Dewey Society Business Meeting
April 12, 2005, Montreal, Canada**

Introduction of the New Board Members

President David Hansen opened the meeting by introducing three new board members for the 2005-2008 term: Kathy Hytten (Southern Illinois University), Christine McCarthy (University of Iowa) and Harriet Cuffaro (Bank Street College, Emerita). President Hansen thanked Dick Gibboney and Craig Kridel for serving on the Board.

Approval of Minutes

Minutes from the 2004 Board meeting in San Diego were approved with no changes.

Membership and Financial Reports (see sheet)

Jeanne Connell presented the membership report. Membership in 2004 included 264 active members.

Annual Meeting Program Report

Program Chair Larry Hickman reported on the AERA program. The John Dewey society was allocated 4 slots of the program in 2005 in addition to the annual symposium, annual lecture, SIG business meeting, and the reception. The Society was able to accept seven out of eleven submissions and grouped these into several sessions. President Hansen added that the annual symposium "Re-reading Dewey's Democracy and Education," and the annual lecture present by Professor Herbert Kliebard, were both well-attended, as was the annual reception.

Educational Theory

Nick Burbules reported on the status of Educational Theory and the benefits of the relationship with Blackwell Publishers. The transition to Blackwell Publishers began with the first issue in 2004. Subscribers receive access to 4 other online journals published by Blackwell. Educational Theory has been archived on the Blackwell site from 1994 on at this point. John Dewey Society members continue to receive a discounted subscription rate to Educational Theory. Educational Theory continues to be a highly competitive journal, with a 75% rejection rate. The editorial board averages a 30 day turnaround time for review of manuscripts. David Hansen serves as the JDS representative on the editorial board of the journal until the close of 2005.

ASCD report

Jerry Starrett reported that ASCD was in Orlando Florida.

Lectures Commission

JDS has several outstanding manuscripts from its previous lectures, as these become available we will produce annual lecture books for distribution to members.

Education and Culture

A. G. Rud (Purdue University) reported on Education and Culture (he began in Fall 2004, Volume 20, Issue 2. A. G. reported that he is receiving an adequate number of submissions. He has received 40 manuscripts thus far with a 50% acceptance rate. The review procedure is online, with 2 reviewers per manuscript. One article each year should be an interview with the recipient of the Dewey Lifetime Achievement Award.

Insights

Jon Bradley, Editor of Insights will continue to serve as Editor. The Daniel Tanner fund will be used to support Insights in 2006 to assist the budget. Insights is also now archived on the John Dewey Website. Larry Hickman will work out a formal arrangement with Daniel Tanner.

The Daniel Tanner Endowment

Peter Hlebowitsh reported on the current status of the The Daniel Tanner Endowment. Total value of the fund 2004 was \$15,974.

The Dewey Lecture books published by TC Press continue to provide royalties to the Society each year. Maxine Greene's book *Dialectic of Freedom* has sold 18,297 copies since 1988, Nel Noddings' book *Educating for Intelligent Belief or Unbelief* has sold 2,293 copies since 1993, Michael Apple's book *Cultural Politics and Education* has sold 7,548 copies since 1996, John Goodlad's *In Praise of Education* has sold 6,839 copies, Jane Roland Martin's book *Cultural Miseducation* sold 1,147 copies since 2002, and Philip Jackson's book *John Dewey and the Philosopher's Task* has sold 612 copies since 2002.

New Business

Leonard Waks raised the question about making JDS SIG dues more in line with other SIG dues in order to attract more SIG members to AERA. A discussion ensued about SIG membership costs and Dewey membership and because of the time constraints, it was decided that the Board would take up this question by email discussion. President Hansen presented the Presidential Gavel-- engraved with the name of the society-- along with the membership's best wishes to incoming President Larry Hickman.
